## Mr Julian Leeser MP, Member for Berowra

The China Matters study tour helped deepen my understanding of the People's Republic of China. The drivers of the middle class Chinese people we met and the economic analysis we received from experts presented a broader picture of China from the one presented in media reports. China faces a series of difficulties – a slowing economy, tenseness in its relations and a possible trade war with the USA, and some dissatisfaction with the direction of domestic policy by middle class people.

The China Matters study tour did not feed us "a line". It was not propaganda. It was a critical appraisal of China, its challenges, its future. I am grateful for the opportunity to participate.
